The information presented here represents data specific to Crawford County, Wisconsin from 2001-2006, and is meant to complement the report, he urden of ui ide in is onsin. Please refer to this report for technical notes and suicide prevention strategies. For counties with fewer than 20 suicides each year, data are aggregated for 2001-2006 and findings are presented in bullets rather than tables.

KEY FINDINGS

The suicide rate in Crawford County for all years was lower than the state rate for all years (6.7! versus 11.8).

Suicide represented a total of 419 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 438.4 for 2001-2006. This was more than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.

The cost of inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department visits due to self-inflicted injury was over \$209,000 in 2006 alone.

The most frequently used methods in Crawford County suicides were firearms (43%) and hanging/strangulation/ suffocation (43%).
