The information presented here represents data specific to Washington County, Wisconsin from 2001-2006, and is meant to complement the report, he urden of ui ide in is onsin. Please refer to this report for technical notes and suicide prevention strategies. For counties with fewer than 20 suicides each year, data are aggregated for 2001-2006 and findings are presented in bullets rather than tables.

KEY FINDINGS

◆The suicide rate in Washington County for all years was lower than the state rate for all years (9.2 versus 11.8).

- ◆Suicide represented a total of 2,347 years of potential life lost, at a rate of 335.0 for 2001-2006. This was less than the state rate (394.1 YPLL) for the same time period.
- ◆The greatest number of suicides occurred in individuals aged 35-44, while the greatest number of hospitalizations and emergency department visits occurred in younger individuals, aged 15-24. This finding is the same at the state level.
- ◆The cost of inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department visits due to self-inflicted injury was over \$953,000 in 2006 alone.
- ♦ Firearms were the most frequently used method in Washington County suicides (47%) followed by hanging, strangulation, or suffocation (28%) and poisoning (22%).
