Froedtert & MCW Occupational Health is located on the fifth floor of the Froedtert Pavilion. Clinic hours are 7:00 am-4:30 pm. Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. The clinic provides immunizations, titers, post-exposure evaluations and follow-ups and maintains the occupational health records for students, employees, and faculty. They accept walk-ins, however, prefer that you call the clinic at (414) 805-6699 to schedule an appointment. Post-exposure evaluations do not require an appointment and should be performed as soon after the exposure as possible. The following is a synopsis of the protocol students should follow after an exposure incident.

- Travel medicine services
- Assistance with paperwork for away rotations
- Substance abuse testing (drug and alcohol)
- Respirator fit testing
- Animal allergy clearance

An exposure incident is defined as a possible transfer of blood or infectious body fluids from the source to another person. Exposures are caused by receiving a needle stick or a cut with a sharp object, a splash to your eyes, nose, or mouth, or to open areas on your skin.
